- Focus on the extracurricular activities you enjoy most. *Get involved* and maybe even try for a leadership position
- Maintain good attendance and grades
- Sign up to take the PSAT test in *October* if you are college bound. This is a preliminary SAT test which can put you in the running for some nice scholarship money
- Take the ASVAB test if you are interested in the military
- Attend the Wisconsin Education Fair in the fall to start gathering information on schools and the military
- Use the Internet to gather information on post secondary options
- In January, choose courses for your Senior year. Keep post-high school entrance requirements in mind.
- Attend your Junior visit with your counselor in February or March to discuss Senior schedule and plans for after high school
- Meet with representatives from colleges of interest when they come to Craig. See the calendar outside of the Guidance office.
- Visit campuses of schools you may be interested in attending after high school

- If you are planning on attending a 4-year college, take either the ACT or SAT (or both) in the Spring. If you do not have a history of doing well on standardized tests, consider taking a ACT preparatory course.
- If you have taken AP classes, consider taking the AP exam(s) in May
- Ask teachers if they would be willing to write a letter of recommendation for you, if you need them for your college applications. Please provide them with a resume that describes your academic record, extracurricular activities, volunteer service and employment.
