The Robotics club is combining the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology. We are the Rock County Robotics Club, FIRST Robotics Team 3692. We are comprised of students from Parker, Craig and Milton High Schools in Rock County Wisconsin. We participate in an educational and exciting robotics program sponsored by FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology). We call FIRST Robotics Competition the ultimate Sport for the Mind. High School student participants call it "the hardest fun you'll ever have." Under strict rules, limited resources, and an intense six-week time limit, teams of 20 or more students are challenged to raise funds, design a team "brand," hone teamwork skills, and build and program industrial-size robots to play a difficult field game against like-minded competitors. It's as close to real-world engineering as a student can get. Volunteer professional mentors lend their time and talents to guide each team.
