

Dear Craig Community,

It's time for me to trade in the baby monitor I've been wearing on my hip for an administrative radio! A week from today, I return to the office, after spending 14 weeks at home with our baby girl Oaklee. She came into our lives without much notice, less than 24 hours in fact, so my need to be away from work came about suddenly. I want to express my sincere thanks to the Craig community - students, parents, and staff - who made adjustments in my absence and sent well wishes and congratulatory greetings. Mr. Monte Phillips deserves a special recognition for stepping up to serve as Acting Principal from mid-April through July. He had no warning and zero chance to prepare, but he did a phenomenal job taking care of business. Mr. Phillips is definitely a pinch hitter! Thank you, Monte.

I will return to work this year with a new perspective - that of educator and parent. I've had a lot of time to think about teaching and learning in the time I've been at home. Middle of the night feedings allow quiet time for reflection. *What do I want for Oaklee when she enters school? What about many years later in high school? What would I want from her teachers and principals some day?* Thinking earnestly on those questions has helped me develop a focus for the year. I am going to call this my year of "boots on the ground."

So, what will you see me doing differently this year in light of that "boots on the ground" approach?

1. I have set a personal goal to observe every teacher in his/her classroom and to meet with teachers to discuss their teaching practice after the observations. Why? Because the rubber hits the road in classrooms. The number one predictor of students' success is the efficacy of their teachers. My visits to classrooms is important to kids and parents because it helps ensure that high-performing teachers are delivering top-notch instruction, and it is important to teachers because it allows me to offer them coaching and support.
2. The school improvement goals I have set for our staff will be few in number, plain and simple, and drive our work and professional development throughout the year. We will focus on two critical pieces - ASSESSMENT and LITERACY. Why?
  - *Assessment* is equally as important as the curriculum teachers deliver and the instructional methods they use to teach. It tells us what students know and what they don't know. And, perhaps most importantly, it helps teachers know how to respond when students don't know something.
  - *Literacy* has been and will continue to be a focus for our entire staff. We will work to ensure all Craig kids can read and write effectively, preparing them for college and career. This includes something we call *disciplinary literacy* which means knowing how to read and write in a given field. For example, my husband is a small business owner who works in construction - excavation and aggregate production, specifically. The reading material he reads at work and the emails he writes look different from those I do. I want to ensure that Craig kids are highly skilled as readers and writers, so they can excel in college and their chosen jobs when they leave school. I should mention that numeracy (numbers/math) is a type of literacy, and we will work with teachers that use numbers in their instruction to ensure our kids hold their own with math skills, too.

3. Communicating with members of the Craig community is the final step in this “boots on the ground” approach to school leadership. For students, that means continuing efforts like the Cougar School Improvement Team to hear their concerns and involve them in improving our school. For parents, that means keeping everyone informed about important news and happenings with a new Facebook page (please “like” my new page @craigcougarpride). For staff, that means sitting in PLC meetings to address team questions and concerns and scheduling *Lunches with Alison* to know what academic departments need. Please, if there is something you need, reach out. I am here to serve. Feel free to email, call, Facebook message, or visit me whenever a need arises (my contact information is included below).

“Boots on the ground” is about being present where it matters - in classrooms - keeping the focus clear and where it needs to be (assessment and literacy), and ensuring everyone connected to Craig has the information they need. I will push myself to get all this done because it’s what I know is right as an educator and because it is what I would want for Oaklee.

I should mention that quite a bit of work has been done this summer to make sure we are ready for the first day of school. Mr. Phillips has been working to hire high-quality teachers and paraprofessionals to serve students. We will meet with them all in a few weeks to orient them to our school. Teachers and instructional leaders have been meeting this summer to review the grading policy and develop “operating procedures” to ensure that grades reflect learning and that students clearly understand what we expect in terms of academic behavior. And, from my occasional visits to Craig, I know our summer work team - custodians and clerical staff - have been working hard to make sure we are up and running for day one.

Enjoy these last few weeks of summer! The back-to-school flyers, fall sports practice, and Rock County Fair are all reminders that summer days are winding down. So, take time to relax and enjoy time with family and friends.

I look forward to welcoming everyone back!

In an effort to streamline the registration process, the School District of Janesville will continue with mandatory online registration for the 2017-18 school year. The complete process to enroll online may be found at [www.janesville.k12.wi.us](http://www.janesville.k12.wi.us) or at the Craig High School home page [www.craighighschool.org](http://www.craighighschool.org), beginning today, July 10, 2017. Parents and guardians will use the Infinite Campus Parent Portal data management system to complete the registration process. Parents can login using their existing username and password. If parents are in need of their login information, the following resources are available to assist with this issue:

**New students to the School District of Janesville, or students coming from Janesville's Parochial schools, will need to contact the School District of Janesville's New Student Enrollment Office at 743-5153.** All students will be required to register online. Online registration will be available beginning July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

### **The Registration process will be done in two-parts:**

1. The parents/guardians will need to login into Infinite Campus using their existing Parent Portal account information. Links to Infinite Campus will be made available to all parents beginning July 10, 2017.
2. The links will be found at [www.janesville.k12.wi.us](http://www.janesville.k12.wi.us) or at the Craig High School home page [www.craighighschool.org](http://www.craighighschool.org)
3. The primary parent/guardian will approve/update all student information through the online registration process.
4. **Most Notably, students only need to attend Registration Day on Thursday, August 17, 2017 to turn in their emergency contact card, get his/her ID and yearbook picture taken, pick up their schedule, and pay fees in person if not paid online.**
5. Registration times are different from previous years and are divided by grade level. Students are strongly encouraged to register at their assigned grade level time.

### **Students should bring:**

- Completed emergency contact card
- Payment for school fees or receipt if paid online
- Payment for school photos or receipt if purchased online

### **Students will receive/complete on August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017:**

- Fall schedule: this includes locker and combination information
- Registration receipt. This receipt should be taken to each checkpoint during registration and initialed by staff when payment/information is received. Please save your receipt.
- Complete their school photo
- Textbooks (Limited Distribution)
- First day of school schedule.

### **PARKING PERMITS**

Parking Permits will be available for purchase beginning August 7 - August 10, 2017. Sales will be in the AP office from 8:00am-11:00am. Permits will also be available for purchase on August 17<sup>th</sup> during Registration. They will be available on the first day of school until they are sold out. Beginning the 2017-18 school year, students who purchase campus parking permits will be assigned a specific stall in their determined lot, based on availability. **North Lot stalls are reserved for Seniors, only.** Once a permit is purchased, students will be assigned a numbered stall that is designated for their exclusive use. The stall will be their designated stall for the entire year, or for the duration of their permit. Parking permits will be sold on a "first come, first serve" basis. **Students and families will be notified by the school when the permit sales will begin.** Students must have all textbooks returned and fines/fees paid, proof of vehicle registration, proof of insurance and have a valid driver's license at the time of purchase. **The Cost of a Permit is \$100.00.** Based on changes to district policy, alternative payment plans will be made available; **\$25 per/quarter, \$50 per/semester, or \$100 yearly pass.** Parking Privileges may be revoked based on administrative discretion. 3. Complete the Emergency Contact card included in this mailing. If the emergency card is not brought to registration, a delay in the process will result. Additional cards will be available before registration day in the AP office Room #308, at the Student Orientation meetings August 14 and August 15, or on Registration day.

## STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESSFUL TEENS

### REQUEST TO WITHHOLD DIRECTORY DATA & MILITARY/HIGHER EDUCATION OBJECTION

If you do NOT want student information or photos released, you must sign a "Request to Withhold Directory Data" form available at registration and the school office. If we have not received this form within 14 days of distribution of the school handbook, according to state statues, the data may be released. Please understand that by signing this form, your child will not have his/her picture or name in such things as the school year-book, student newspaper, sports programs, awards programs, music/drama program, and *The Janesville Gazette* (news stories, graduation issue). **There can be no exceptions.**

Also, federal law requires educational agencies to provide recruiters, upon request, names, addresses and telephone listings. If you do NOT want this information available, please fill out and return the "Parental Objection" form within 14 days of enrollment.

### FREE OR REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED ALL YEAR

Applications for free or reduced school meal benefits may be submitted *any time during the school year*. Contact your school office or the Business Services office at the ESC, 527 S. Franklin.



### MOVING?

If you move over the summer, please call 743-5200 as soon as possible to determine what paperwork is needed. If moving outside the School District of Janesville, in most cases students may continue attending their current school as long as you complete the paperwork within the required timeline. *No address change can be made without proof of residency*, which must have your name, current address, and date of the move. Every problem is not going to disappear, or every dream will not come true, but if you do the work, you will become a stronger, wiser, more competent person.
